

Sebastian Peake is the eldest of Mervyn Peake's and Maeve Gilmore's three children. For many years he worked in the wine trade but now spends much of his time giving illustrated talks on his father's life and work at literary festivals and other events. He is the author of a memoir, *A Child of Bliss*.

Alison Eldred ran the artists' agency Young Artists (now Arena) from 1976 to 2000 and continues to act as a consultant with the agency. She has considerable experience of working in the field of book illustration, especially in the areas of science fiction and children's books.

G. Peter Winnington has been researching Mervyn Peake's life and work for more than thirty years. He has edited periodicals on Peake and revised the texts of the Titus books for Penguin. His biography of Mervyn Peake, *Vast Alchemies: The Life and Work of Mervyn Peake*, was published by Peter Owen in 2000, and he has a critical study coming out shortly.

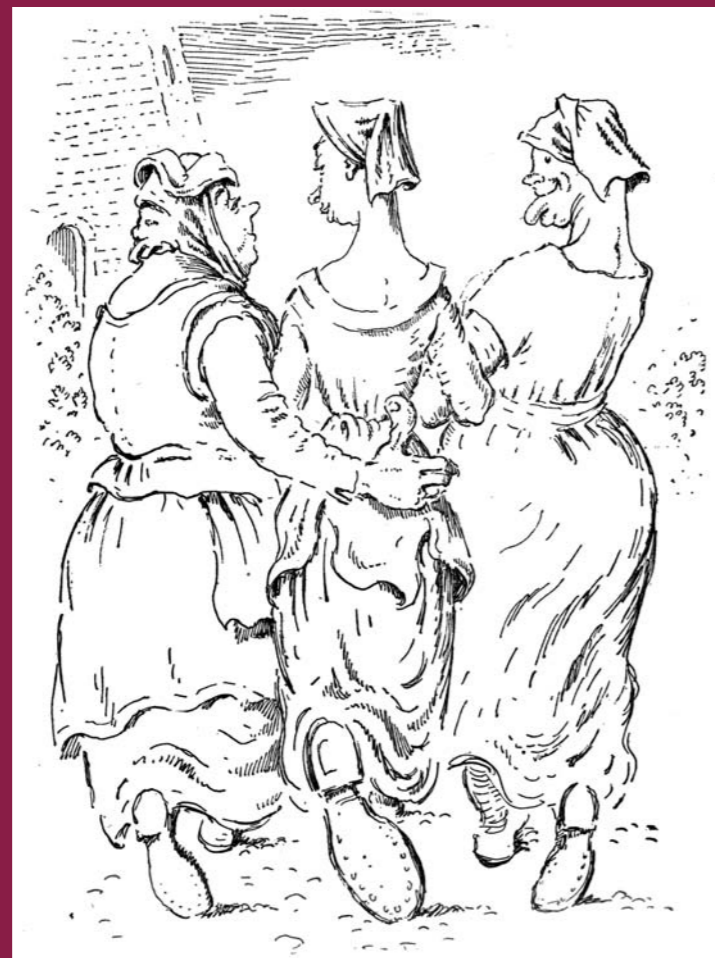

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Mervyn Peake The Man and His Art

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Mervyn Peake, best known as author of the three celebrated Titus books, was one of the most multi-talented artists of the twentieth century. Painter, novelist, author of children's books and nonsense verse, war artist, poet and dramatist, he also illustrated such classic works as *Treasure Island*, *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, *The Ancient Mariner*, *Grimm's Household Tales* and *Bleak House*. A man of extraordinary vision and imagination, his literary and artistic creations are unforgettable, and his influence is felt to this day.

In this highly illustrated volume, his son Sebastian Peake has collaborated with Alison Eldred and G. Peter Winnington, author of an acclaimed biography of Mervyn Peake, to compile a stunning collection of illustrations, paintings, photographs, notebook pages and other material – much of which has never been published before – to produce a unique memoir of the artist's life and work. Contributors include the writers Michael Moorcock and Joanne Harris, Langdon Jones (editor of *Titus Alone*), artists John Howe and Chris Riddell, David Glass and John Constable, creators of the stage version of the Gormenghast trilogy, and Estelle Daniels, producer of the BBC television dramatization. The book includes sections on Peake's upbringing as the son of a missionary in China, marriage and fatherhood, experiences as a war artist, creation of the Titus novels, *Mr Pye* and other literary works, and his tragic decline as illness overcame him, resulting in his early death.

It is now sixty years on from the first publication of *Titus Groan*, one of the most sustained flights of imaginative writing of the twentieth century, and the time is ripe for a reassessment of the legacy of one of Britain's most original artists. This handsome volume is a must for art historians and all fans of Mervyn Peake's work.
